# 2024-187 <u>Consideration of a Resolution of Shared Alignment of Guilford County</u> <u>Transportation Stakeholders in the Promotion and Development of Transportation Services</u>

City Council is requested to consider a Resolution Supporting Shared Alignment of Guilford County, The City of Greensboro, The City of High Point, and Regional Transportation Stakeholders in the Promotion and Development of Transportation Services in a More Unified Manner.

Damon Dequenne, Assistant City Manager, presented the item and explained the shared transportation vision and goals between the City of High Point, the City of Greensboro, Guilford County, and the Piedmont Regional Transportation Authority. He communicated that the resolution presented in the item would help to improve efficiency at and between jurisdictional boundaries, examine gaps in service and barriers to access, and to explore opportunities to align service offerings.

Committee Member Harman asked for some background on the conversation between the different entities.

Mr. Dequenne shared that the Guilford County Board of Commissioners allocated a million dollars to form a working group to study regional transportation issues. He explained that the group consisted of members of each of the parties on the resolution, as well as members of city staff and council. He said that the group found the need for the different jurisdictions to work together to improve transportation services and access throughout all the jurisdictions.

Committee Member Harmon said that he was excited about this collaboration.
