Recent Highlights of Legislative, Policy and Agency Work

- Drafted and secured \$400,000 EPA Brownfield Assessment Grant award. Ranked as the #1 application in the country by EPA.
- Worked with the congressional delegation and the Interior Department / National Park Service to resolve a land grant issue between High Point University and the City.
- Working with HUD on an issue related to implementation of the Lead Based Paint Hazard Control Grant (Grant award - \$5,475,000).
- Drafted and submitted comments to the Federal Communications Commission regarding preservation of local control related to siting wireless facilities.
- Drafted letters to the congressional delegation outlining High Point's priorities in comprehensive tax reform. Drafted related resolutions for the City's review.
- Drafted letters to the congressional delegation relaying High Point's support for online sales tax legislation.
- Drafted High Point letters of support to the congressional delegation for full funding of HUD's CDBG and HOME programs.
- Organized meeting and follow up with HUD on Planning Grant application for Daniel Brooks Housing Community. Also drafted congressional support letters for the application.
- Worked with the High Point Police Department on a grant application to the Bureau of Justice Assistance for the High Point Offender Focused Domestic Violence Initiative.
- Weekly legislative and grant updates that address local priorities and issues.
- Real-time updates and advocacy alerts on critical legislative and policy action.
