On Monday, November 9, 2015 about 9 pm, Baker Team received an audible Tracker Alert Alarm which noted an unauthorized movement of merchandise or money from a bank or store. The Tracker Alert Alarm is a GPS signal transmitted via the internet to monitoring agencies and this was coming from a Verizon store in Thomasville. Davidson County 911 had just received a call from the Verizon Store indicating an armed robbery had taken place there. Baker Team tracked the signal until it indicated it was headed into the High Point City Limits. An announcement was made on the main police dispatch channel to the Thomasville Police Department confirming an armed robbery of 63-I phones valued at \$56,000. Officer Alex Lingerfelt spotted a vehicle fitting the description at Brentwood St and Lowe Ave. He initiated a traffic stop and the armed robbery suspects were apprehended and arrested.
