SUMMARY The HPPD, with ICAC Program funding, will be able to develop an improved effective manner in which to respond to cases that involve the exploitation of children through the use of social media and other internet sites. Funds will provide our Detectives with the necessary tools and training to develop a proper technology forensic unit to find and prosecute child predators. Non-network secured computers, computer equipment and software will be used to find and track child predators and gain enough evidence to prosecute them. Evaluation Method:

The HPPD will be able to evaluate the objective by the number of cases investigated and sent for prosecution.

2. Project Objective:

Training to include ICAC Task Force Training, ICAC Investigative Techniques, ICAC Undercover Chat Concepts & Techniques and ICAC Unit Supervisor training. This training will provide up-to-date techniques to investigate and track internet crimes against children.

Performance Measure:

This will be measured by the knowledge gained by ICAC detectives during the training and the techniques gained to investigate cases and bring those offenders to prosecution. Evaluation Method:

The HPPD will be able to evaluate the objective by the number of cases that are brought to prosecution by the new techniques gained during the training of the ICAC Detectives and the supervisor of the unit.

Project Sustainability Planning
