PURPOSE:

A budget amendment is needed to recognize grant revenue related to the North Carolina Department of Public Safety Governor's Crime Commission Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Program grant.

BACKGROUND:

The High Point Police Department applied for and has been awarded funds in the amount of \$41,702.10 to purchase equipment to enhance investigations of internet crimes against children. The funds will help protect children from predators who seek to harm or exploit them through cyberstalking. Funds will be used to purchase computer equipment, software, and accessories to enhance investigations of internet crimes against children.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The budget amendment recognizes \$41,702 coming from the North Carolina Department of Public Safety Governor's Crime Commission. This grant requires no local match.

RECOMMENDATION / ACTION REQUESTED:

The Budget Department recommends and asks the Council to approve the budget amendment.

**“AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE 2016-2017 BUDGET ORDINANCE
OF THE CITY OF HIGH POINT, NORTH CAROLINA
FOR THE INTERNET CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN GRANT**

Be it ordained by the City Council of the City of High Point, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. The City of High Point Police Department has received a grant from the North Carolina Department of Public Safety for the Internet Crimes Against Children program.

Section 2. In order to recognize these funds, the 2016-2017 Budget Ordinance of the City of High Point, should be amended as follows:

- (A) That Special Grants Fund revenues be amended as follows:

State Grants	\$41,702
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- (B) That the Special Grants Fund expenditures be amended as follows:

Police Grants	\$41,702
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Section 3. That all ordinances, or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall be effective from and after its passage."
