
Code Enforcement Activity Report for January 2017

This report serves to summarize Code Enforcement activity for the month of January 2017. Staff received 31 new minimum housing complaints and have 198 active minimum housing cases (127 cases remain from the old system); 45 public nuisance complaints (104 active public nuisance cases) and collected 512 signs during the month of January. Additionally:


- The backlog of minimum housing cases from the old system has dropped significantly from 270 (from May 2016) to 127 for January.
- The continued dramatic reduction of public nuisance complaints reflects the combination of seasonal changes (i.e. cooler weather) and the identification of violations proactively by staff.
- Local Code Enforcement Officers continue to collect signs one Saturday per month in addition to normal hours.
- The State Code Enforcement, Inc. was terminated on January 31, 2017.




- Minimum housing complaints received by staff have been steady averaging 33 per month.
- Increasing active minimum housing cases reflect expanding caseloads by Local Codes Enforcement Officers
- The steady reduction in the minimum housing case backlog from the old systems reflect the continued focus on clearances.
- Public nuisance complaints reflect seasonal variations and proactive enforcement by staff.
- The reduction in active public nuisance cases reflects the seasonal drop in monthly complaints.




414 Hodgin St- Before



414 Hodgin St - After




705 Thissell St - Before


616 Wesley Dr. - Before


