- **WHEREAS**, there is current discussion by the Guilford County Commissioners pertaining to the potential relocation of the Guilford County Animal Shelter; and,
- **WHEREAS,** the City of High Point Police department transported approximately 2,400 animals to the shelter during 2016; and,
- WHEREAS, moving the shelter from its current location off Wendover Avenue to a site farther north in Guilford County will significantly increase travel time for High Point Animal Control Officers, causing them to be unavailable for service for additional hours each week; and,
- **WHEREAS**, a shelter location farther away will increase the wait time for an animal to receive needed care; and,
- WHEREAS, the Wendover Avenue location appears to be centrally located in Guilford County. High Point residents can redeem animals easier than if the shelter were moved further away. Some of our lower income families already struggle to make a trip to the shelter on Wendover due to transportation issues. If High Point residents cannot or will not drive to the new location, then larger number of animals will be euthanized.

NOW THEREFORE IT BE RESOLVED that the High Point City Council supports the Guilford County Animal Shelter remaining in its current location at 4525 Wendover Avenue.
