Subject: Code Enforcement Activity Report for May 2017
This report serves to summarize Code Enforcement activity for the month of May 2017. Staff received 37 new minimum housing complaints ( 257 active minimum housing cases); 244 new public nuisance complaints (339 active public nuisance cases) and collected 78 signs during the month of May. Additionally:

- The backlog of minimum housing cases from the old system continue to drop from 270 (from May 2016) to 66 for May.
- An expected increase in public nuisance complaints reflects seasonally warmer temperatures; public nuisance cases have continued to increase since last month's report.
- Local Code Enforcement Officers didn't work on a Saturday in May but will resume weekend sign collection in June.
