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| Financing | Support legislation that would classify municipal securities as high quality liquid assets. H.R. 1624 passed the House; S. 828 awaits Senate action. Support legislation that would reinstate tax-exempt advance refunding bonds (which was repealed in the tax law). H.R. 5003 was introduced on February 13, 2018. | |
| Online Sales Tax Legislation | Support passage of legislation that would grant state and local governments the authority to collect taxes on internet and mail-order sales. | |
