- ✓ *During the Summer hours, the Museum is open on Sundays from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.*

The City of High Point provides funding for the building/maintenance, employee salaries, etc..... and the Museum continues to rely on support from the High Point Historical Society to fill its galleries and to raise funds for projects that exceed the Museum's operational budget.

 - ✓ *Strength in Numbers: Women's Organizations in High Point that highlights the following four organizations that played a major role in the development of High Point: Alpha Art Club, The Women's Club, Junior League of High Point, and Young Women's Christian Association (YWCA) (on display until mid-October).*
