High Point Central Senior Lakin Stevens Chosen to Participate in National Sustainability Service Learning Program

HIGH POINT, N.C. (November 14, 2018) – Keep America Beautiful, the nation's iconic community improvement nonprofit organization, has selected High Point's Lakin Stevens as one of 11 high school students from across the country to serve on its seventh national Youth Advisory Council.

Keep America Beautiful's national <u>Youth Advisory Council</u> provides a unique opportunity for high school students to participate in a service-learning and leadership development program focusing on environmental stewardship and sustainability. The newly-selected members will act as ambassadors for youth service at the local level and will be provided stipends to implement local stewardship service projects.

Lakin Stevens, a senior at High Point Central High School, is an inaugural member of the Keep High Point Beautiful Youth Council and extremely passionate about the environment. Stevens said, "My passion and care for the environment has always been a part of me. Stevens has also served as a Communities in Schools Breakfast Buddy, Greensboro Science Center Teacher's Assistant, a Summer Camp Counselor in Training and worked with the High Point Miracle League.
