PURPOSE:

To increase the initial purchase order for Rain for Rent to extend the emergency bypass of the Riverdale Pump Station for an additional five (5) months to complete the initial dry well and wet repairs and to install a submersible pump that will expand the pump station.

BACKGROUND:

The City of High Point transfers wastewater flow to the Eastside WWTP via the Riverdale Pump Station from areas located on the north side of the city. This is the City's largest pump station. During Hurricane Florence, the pump station flooded resulting in damage to three (3) pumps. On October 1, 2018, City Council approved an emergency purchase order for \$121,443.84 for an emergency bypass of the pump station to perform repairs to the dry well. On December 17, 2018, City Council approved an increase of the purchase order to Rain for Rent for an additional 3 months (December, January, February) for pump rental and 24-hour pump watch to repair the dry well and wet well of the pump station for a total amount of \$605,325.39.

BUDGET IMPACT:

Funding for the emergency bypass and the Riverdale Pump Station repairs will come out of the capital project budget.

RECOMMENDATION / ACTION REQUESTED:

The Public Services Department is recommending that Council approve the increase in the emergency purchase order for Rain for Rent from \$605,325.39 to the amount of \$1,261,794.64.
