Thad is an accomplished professional who provides outstanding <u>technical and managerial/executive</u> <u>leadership</u> in <u>organizational budgeting</u>, administration, and <u>financial and performance management</u>. His experience includes analyst, supervisor, manager, and executive positions in government and not-for-profit (NFP) business operations, as well as consulting. He is an expert in <u>budget and</u> <u>performance integration</u>, helping organizations <u>clarify their goals and objectives</u> and then <u>obtain</u>, <u>match</u>, and execute the resources needed to accomplish desired results.

Thad has always been a <u>teacher</u>, beginning with teaching religion to high school students at his church. As a government supervisor, he taught his staff to accomplish their various tasks. He also taught organizational development for the Army and ethics for the Internal Revenue Service. He regularly <u>made presentations at conferences</u>, and he <u>published articles</u> in professional journals. He <u>taught budgeting courses</u> at The Performance Institute, and he was an <u>adjunct lecturer at American</u> <u>University</u>, teaching a graduate course in budgeting and financial management. Currently he <u>teaches</u> <u>online graduate courses</u> in public policy and administration for American University.

Thad enjoys helping others with business operations. He wants to be in the trenches, dealing with issues, solving problems, and enjoying the satisfaction of personally contributing to successful results. He knows how to be either a <u>hands-on manager</u>, a <u>strategic executive</u>, or a <u>trusted advisor</u>, as the circumstances warrant. He is an <u>excellent manager and developer of people</u>, setting high standards for himself and his staff and then helping them achieve those standards. Four of his former employees, including three women, have been Chief Financial Officers of federal agencies.

Thad is active in his community, <u>often in leadership positions</u>. He twice served as <u>President of his</u> <u>homeowners' association</u>, and he completed <u>eight terms as a high school PTA President</u>. He <u>served</u> <u>on county government committees</u> to advise the School Board and to recommend changes in land use policy. He was a <u>member of church Finance Committees</u>, and he <u>coached over 20 seasons of</u> <u>youth athletics</u>. He was a <u>member of the Wake Forest, NC Planning Board</u>.

- After completing college, Thad began work as a GS-5 for the <u>Army in Los Angeles</u>. He later moved to an <u>Army major command in Atlanta</u>, where he also earned a master's degree at night.
- After ten years with the Army, he <u>relocated to Washington, DC</u>, where he progressed from <u>supervisor to manager to senior executive</u> while working for the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration (TIGTA), and the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS).
- During his government service, he also served as <u>Treasurer for five NFP organizations</u> (and subsequently President of three of them).
- He <u>retired from federal service</u> after 34 years and <u>began consulting</u> with Grant Thornton. His clients included agencies in the Departments of Agriculture, Commerce, Energy, and Homeland Security; NASA; and Yale University. He also taught classes at American University in DC.
- After ten years with Grant Thornton, <u>he started his own consulting firm</u>. His clients included North Carolina state government and SAS. He teaches online for American University and volunteered with his church, the Town of Wake Forest, the Wake Forest Chamber of Commerce, and the Executive Service Corps of the Triangle.
