

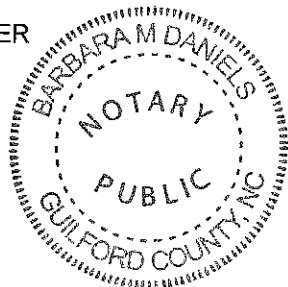

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of High Point, North Carolina has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary to pay capital costs of providing streets and sidewalks, including without limitation bridges, viaducts, causeways, overpasses, underpasses, alleys and bicycle lanes; paving, grading, resurfacing, and widening streets; sidewalks, curbs and gutters, culverts, and drains; traffic controls, signals, and markers; lighting; and grade crossings and the elimination thereof and grade separations; streetscaping, landscaping and pedestrian improvements; transit stop improvements; and the acquisition of land therefor; and

WHEREAS, an application has been filed with the Secretary of the Local Government Commission of North Carolina requesting Commission approval of the General Obligation Streets and Sidewalk Bonds hereinafter described as required by the Local Government Bond Act, and the City Clerk has notified the City Council that the application has been accepted for submission to the Local Government Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the City Council of the City of High Point, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. In order to raise the money required for the purposes described above, in addition to any funds which may be made available for such purpose from any other source, General Obligation Streets and Sidewalk Bonds of the City are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to the Local Government Finance Act of North Carolina. The maximum aggregate principal amount of such General Obligation Streets and Sidewalk Bonds authorized by this order shall be \$22,000,000.

Section 2. Taxes will be levied in an amount sufficient to pay the principal and interest on the General Obligation Streets and Sidewalk Bonds.

Section 3. A sworn statement of the City's debt has been filed with the City Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Section 4. This bond order will take effect when approved by the voters of the City at a referendum scheduled for November 5, 2019.

The foregoing bond order has been introduced and a sworn statement of debt has been filed under the Local Government Bond Act showing the appraised value of the City of High Point, North Carolina to be \$9,753,508,621 and the net debt thereof, including the proposed bonds, to be \$163,808,722. The finance officer of the City of High Point has filed a statement estimating that the total amount of interest that will be paid on the bonds over the expected term of the bonds, if issued, is \$12,100,000. The estimate is preliminary, is for general informational purposes only, and may differ from the actual interest paid on the bonds. A tax will be levied to pay the principal and interest on the bonds if they are issued. Anyone who wishes to be heard on the questions of the validity of the bond order and the advisability of issuing the bonds may appear at a public hearing or an adjournment thereof to be held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building located at 211 South Hamilton Street in High Point, North Carolina, at 5:30 p.m. on the 19th day of August, 2019.

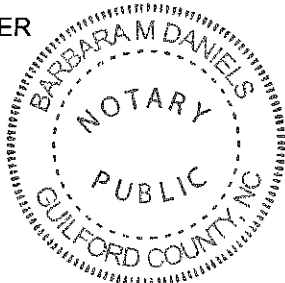

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of High Point, North Carolina has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary to pay capital costs of providing for the acquisition, construction, renovation, improvement, expansion, furnishing and equipping of parks and recreation facilities, including without limitation senior centers, athletic fields, parks, playgrounds, recreation centers, shelters and pool facilities and the acquisition of land therefor; and

WHEREAS, an application has been filed with the Secretary of the Local Government Commission of North Carolina requesting Commission approval of the General Obligation Parks and Recreation Bonds hereinafter described as required by the Local Government Bond Act, and the City Clerk has notified the City Council that the application has been accepted for submission to the Local Government Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the City Council of the City of High Point, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. In order to raise the money required for the purposes described above, in addition to any funds which may be made available for such purpose from any other source, General Obligation Parks and Recreation Bonds of the City are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to the Local Government Finance Act of North Carolina. 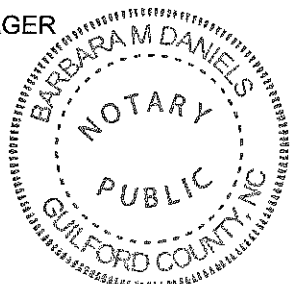

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of High Point, North Carolina (the "City Council") has ascertained and hereby determines that it is necessary to pay capital costs of providing housing projects for the benefit of persons of low income, or moderate income, or low and moderate income, including without limitation construction or acquisition of projects to be owned by the City or a housing authority, and loans, grants, interest supplements and other programs of financial assistance to persons of low income, or moderate income, or low and moderate income, and developers of housing for persons of low income, or moderate income, or low and moderate income, and the acquisition of land therefor; and

WHEREAS, an application has been filed with the Secretary of the Local Government Commission of North Carolina requesting Commission approval of the General Obligation Housing Bonds herein-after described as required by the Local Government Bond Act, and the City Clerk has notified the City Council that the application has been accepted for submission to the Local Government Commission.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED by the City Council of the City of High Point, North Carolina, as follows:

Section 1. In order to raise the money required for the purposes described above, in addition to any funds which may be made available for such purpose from any other source, General Obligation Housing Bonds of the City are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to the Local Government Finance Act of North Carolina.
