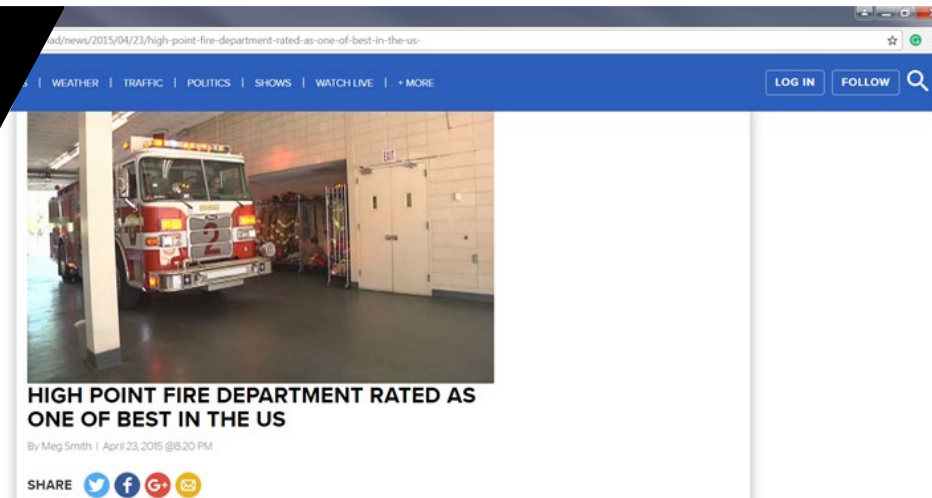
Organized in 1890

ISO Class 1 affords both business and residential customers in the City the lowest possible rates for fire insurance



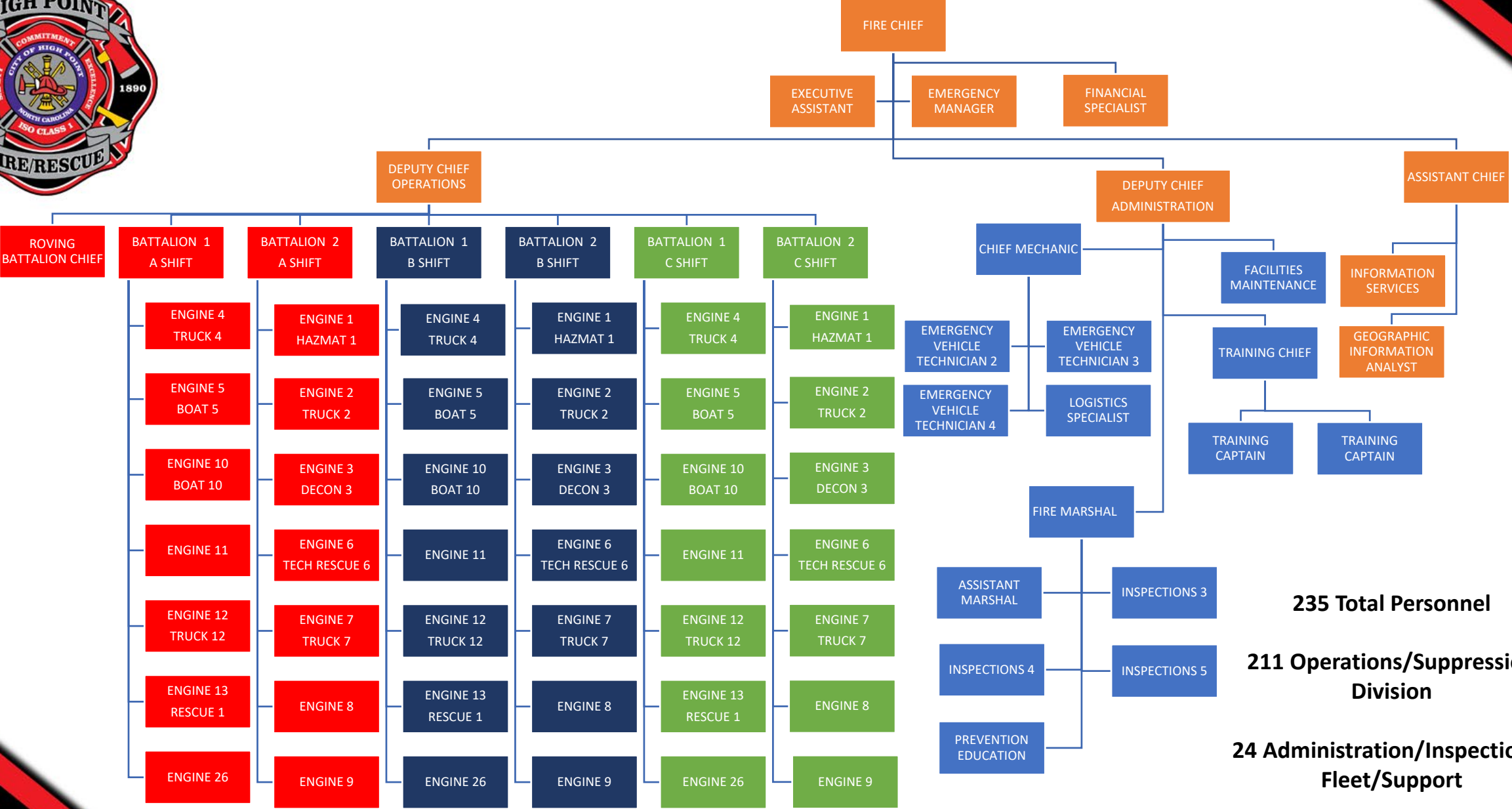

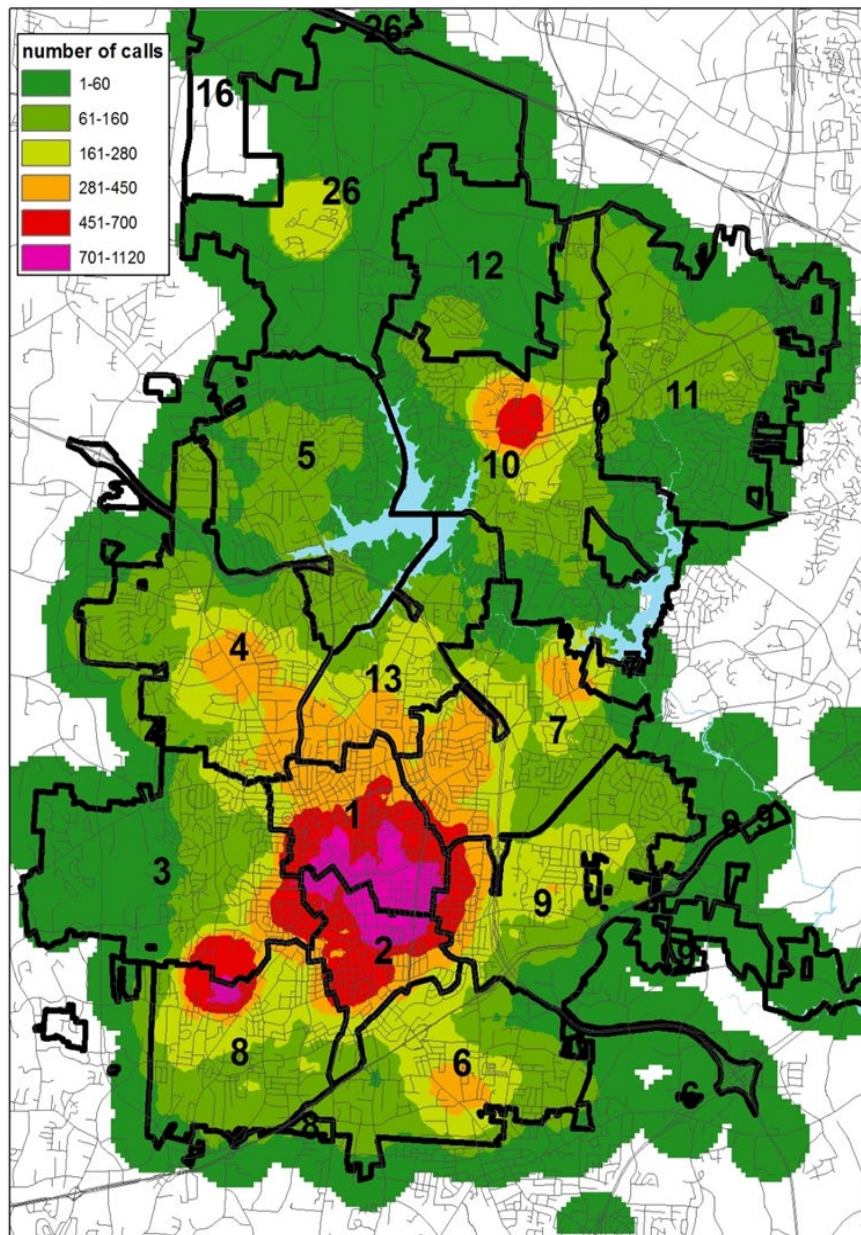
