2020-176 <u>Resignation of City Manager Greg Demko and Approval of Separation</u> <u>Agreement</u>

The City Council is requested to accept the resignation of City Manager Greg Demko and approve a Separation Agreement between the City of High Point and Mr. Demko. Mr. Demko's resignation will be effective immediately upon acceptance of the resignation by the City Council.

Upon reconvening into Open Session at 3:38 p.m., Mayor Wagner announced that the City Council has received the resignation from City Manager Greg Demko effective today. He thanked the city manager for his service to the City of High Point and wished him well in his future endeavors.

The Mayor advised that a legal Separation Agreement between the City of High Point and Mr. Demko would be executed and the document would be a matter of public record and available for public review. Mayor Wagner then entertained a motion to accept the resignation of the city manager and to approve the Separation Agreement. [The separation agreement will be attached in Legistar and incorporated as a permanent part of these proceedings.]

Council Member Jefferson moved to accept City Manager Greg Demko's resignation to be effective today and to approve the separation agreement between the City of High Point and Mr. Demko. Council Member Johnson made a second to the motion.

For further discussion, Council Member Hudson commented that "this vote is the end of a path that the Council should have never gone down."

Council Member Jones added to Council Member Hudson's comment and stated "this is not the direction that I wanted to go."

Mayor Wagner asked if there were any additional comments.

Making reference to the previous comments about the path, Council Member Holmes stated "*it wasn't a great deal of options left for us, and, unfortunately, we arrived here and things needed to be done.* And, unfortunately, this is where it led to."

Council Member Jefferson shared his excitement about High Point's future.

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Mayor Wagner asked if there were any additional comments. There being none, he proceeded with a roll call vote on the motion to accept the city manager's resignation effective immediately and to approve the Separation Agreement between the City of High Point and Mr. Demko. The motion carried by the following 6-3 vote:

- Aye (6): Mayor Wagner, Mayor Pro Tem Williams, Council Member Johnson, Council Member Jefferson, Council Member Peters, and Council Member Holmes
- Nay (3): Council Member Moore, Council Member Jones, and Council Member Hudson

2020-177 Appointment of Interim City Manager

Upon acceptance of the resignation of City Manager Greg Demko, Council is requested to appoint Randy McCaslin as Interim City Manager effective immediately. Mr. McCaslin will serve in the interim position until such time the city manager's position is filled.

Following acceptance of City Manager Greg Demko's resignation, **Council Member Moore moved to appoint Deputy City Manager Randy McCaslin as Interim City Manager effective immediately at his current salary and bonuses (\$214,802.40) to serve until a new city manager is appointed.** Council Member Peters made a second to the motion.

Following a roll call vote by the Mayor, the motion carried by a unanimous 9-0 vote as follows:
