- Length: 1.84 mile urban greenway

- 2. Attract new businesses
- 3. Create new jobs in historic core

Cost Analysis

- The grand total cost is estimated to be \$82,009.38. This grand total includes road construction, trail and pavement markings, and traffic control.
- The funds for the extension would be covered by the High Point Department of Transportation in the 2021-2022 budget.


Throughout this paper, we will be going in depth on how the extension of the Greenway will benefit the community of High Point.²

General Background

The *Heritage Greenway Multi-Modal Connector* Project is part of High Point's new direction to deliver more transportation options and re-claim larger areas of the original downtown for denser development which yields a higher Return on Investment.³ This project focuses on delivering local and regional benefits by providing job opportunities, different means of transportation, and connecting the city of High Point in a way that strengthens economic competitiveness within the global marketplace.

Phase One

The Southwest High Point Heritage Greenway Phase One focuses on providing opportunities for residential as well as commercial development and on connecting parks and neighborhoods to the center city. It is a 1.8-mile greenway that runs through industrial areas and found a use for under-utilized land. Phase One extends from 100 W. High Avenue and S. Main (Amtrak station, local and regional bus terminals), and includes a large section of the International Home Furnishings Market District, including "Times Square," W. Commerce, and S. Elm Street. This path was selected to find usage for the previously abandoned railway property. ⁴

Phase One includes the historic district and heavily stresses maintaining the historic corridor.

This phase was constructed on high standing areas with no bridges or stream crossings. The City of High Point controlled much of the land and used it for transportation businesses, furniture productions, and other light industrial activities. There aren't any disputes over the Phase 1 Greenway's location. Local business owners and residents of High Point were in full support.⁵

Phase Two

Phase two is focused primarily on attracting tourists, creating access to the South River, and creating recreational services. The area would include Dominion Pavilion in Constitution Park and ending at North Park making it a 1.2-mile trail.


The funding would come from the Federal Transportation Enhancement Grant with a 20% match from the City.⁶

Phase Three and Project Location

Phase Three would be from Vail to W. Ward down Cassell Street's existing right of way into the Southside neighborhood, making it a 1.84-mile urban greenway. This plan has engineering plans already completed and existing funds through the High Point Department of Transportation.

Phase Three will extend what is already completed and bring the Greenway closer to connecting Southside and Goldston Parks --first suggested in a plan (adopted by City Council) entitled the Southside Revitalization Plan. This 2004 plan called for creating a Greenway along the floodplains of Richland Creek to connect Goldston and Southside Parks. The 2007 High Point Core City Master Plan didn't recommend a greenway but called for making the southwest quadrant more attractive and marketing it as a high-end industrial/business park. Most successful business parks, we found that most had Greenways. The Greenway concept fits directly into this 2007 master plan too.⁸

Project Description

The Greenway that is already in place is a 1.84-mile public surface transportation connector starting at High Point's mass transit facilities to connect the town-center. The extension of the Greenway project will help to expand the current transportation options within the city of High Point. This project will also increase safety and employment within the Southside neighborhood of High Point because it will offer community members greater access to emerging employment centers within the town. The extension of the Greenway is considered to be an opportunity zone, which can help to attract businesses to create jobs that can help to strengthen the City of High Point's economy.¹⁰

Project Benefits

The expansion of The Greenway creates many business and environmental benefits. On the environmental side, The Greenway will help to clean up the City of High Point. - Utilizes underused City-owned property/ROW and defunct freight railroad bed (rails gone) that weaves throughout the district.
- Creates an intermodal, inner-city business park where people live and work. 5G broadband is available.
- Connects workers to emerging job centers and helps tie rural to urban communities
- Encourages use of regional mass transit facilities to ease the burden of commuting
- Offers safe, transportation options, like walking and bicycling
- Raises quality of life
- Mitigates congestion to improve air quality

Project Funds

The construction of the new Greenway extension will happen as soon as possible if the city council approves it, then the process will begin. The grand total cost is estimated to be \$82,009.38. This grand total includes road construction, trail and pavement markings, and traffic control. Ideally, the cost of the extension would be covered by the High Point Department of Transportation because they have existing funds and engineering plans for this project in the 2021-2022 budget. ¹²
