## **PRESENTATION OF ITEMS**

# 2021-34 <u>Contracts - Kopper's Utility & Industrial Products and Stella-Jones Corp. for</u> <u>Joint Wooden Utility Pole Purchases</u>

City Council is requested to approve award of a contract with Kopper's Utility & Industrial Products for the purchase of Penta Wooden Utility Poles for the City of High Point in the amount of \$60,377.00 based on pricing as identified in Schedule A; and approve a contract with Stella-Jones Corp. based on pricing as identified in Schedule A for the following cities/towns: Huntersville/Cornelius; Kings Mountain; Newton; Statesville; Wilson); and to authorize the appropriate city official to execute these contracts for the purchase of wooden utility poles.

Garey Edwards, Electric Utilities Director, advised that typically, in the past, these bids were handled by the City of Rocky Mount; however, they no longer utilize Penta treated wooden utility poles, so High Point has agreed to administer the combined contract for Penta poles this year. ElectriCities advertised for and solicited bids on behalf of six (6) member cities for the purchase of Penta wooden utility poles; bids were opened on October 23, 2020. Mr. Edwards explained that this is a service provided by ElectriCities to its members in which they solicit combined bids for the purchase of common material, supplies and services and by combining the bids, it allows the poles to be purchased at a much lower cost for each of the cities. Following evaluation of the bids,

ElectriCities determined it to be in the best interest of the participating municipalities to award the contracts as follows all of which are based on Schedule A pricing:

Staff recommends approval of the award of a contract to Kopper's Utility & Industrial Products for the purchase of Penta wooden utility poles in the amount of \$60,377.00 for the City of High Point and approval of award of a contract with Stella-Jones Corp. on behalf of the above-referenced cities for the purchase of Penta wooden utility poles.

Committee Member Holmes asked if the poles would be for replacement or new construction and if they will be strictly High Point property. Mr. Edwards explained these poles are typically purchased and stockpiled to be used as needed and clarified that the poles that High

Point purchases will be City of High Point property; and the remaining member cities' would purchase their poles directly from Stella-Jones and would be invoiced directly for the poles they purchase under the joint contract.

Chairman Moore inquired about the distance the poles are shipped; Mr. Edwards replied that the poles have come as far as Washington State.

Chairman Moore moved to forward this matter to the City Council with a favorable recommendation and place it on the February 1, 2021 City Council Finance Committee Consent Agenda for approval. Committee Member Peters made a second to the motion. Following a roll call vote by Chairman Moore, the motion carried by the following 3-0 unanimous vote:

## 2021-35 <u>Contract - SHI International, Inc. - Charlotte Cooperative Purchasing Alliance (CCPA)</u> Technology Products & Related Services - Data Center - HPPD

City Council is requested to award a contract to SHI International, Inc. (SHI) under the Charlotte Cooperative Purchasing Alliance (CCPA) Technology Products & Related Services in the amount of \$216,003.16 for firewall hardware & software to isolate and secure the City's technological assets at the Data Center in the High Point Police Department Headquarters and the appropriate City official and/or employee be authorized to execute all necessary documents.

Eric Xavier, Assistant Director of IT Services, advised that IT Services will soon be relocating the City's primary Data Center to the new Police Department Headquarters located at 1730 Westchester Drive and converting the current Data Center, located within City Hall, to a fully-replicated disaster recovery site and the new Data center would require its own firewall hardware and software as a defense against cyber attacks. The equipment will be purchased from SHI International, Inc. under the Charlotte Cooperative Purchasing Alliance Technology Products & related services purchasing contract #2020000547. IT Services is recommending award of the contract to SHI International for the purchase of the hardware and software at a cost of \$216,003.16.

Chairman Moore asked if the city would assume responsibility to monitor and maintain the fire wall once it is installed. Mr. Xavier replied that the city would assume responsibility of the firewall 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Chairman Moore moved to forward this matter to the City Council with a favorable recommendation and place it on the February 1, 2021City Council Finance Committee Consent Agenda for approval. Committee Member Holmes made a second to the motion. Following a roll call vote by Chairman Moore, the motion carried by the following 3-0 unanimous vote:

# 2021-36 <u>Contract - WesTech - Eastside Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) - Bar Screen Repair</u>

City Council is requested to approve a sole source contract with WesTech in the amount of \$33,623.00 to purchase repair parts for bar screen #1 at the Eastside Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Terry Houk, Director of Public Services, advised this is a sole source purchase with WesTech, the original manufacturer of the bar screen at the Eastside Wastewater Treatment Plant. He reported that a new unit would cost in the \$150,000-\$175,000 range and Public Services is recommending the purchase of the necessary parts in the amount of \$33,623.00 from WesTech to perform a major rebuild on bar screen #1 at the Eastside Wastewater Treatment Plant.

Chairman Moore moved to forward this matter to the City Council with a favorable recommendation and place it on the February 1, 2021City Council Finance Committee Consent Agenda for approval. Committee Member Holmes made a second to the motion. Following a roll call vote by Chairman Moore, the motion carried by the following 3-0 unanimous vote:
