<u>150373</u> Ordinance - Zoning Case 15-16 - Keystone Group, Inc.

A request by Keystone Group, Inc. to rezone approximately 114.18 acres from an Agricultural (AG) District, within Guilford County's zoning jurisdiction, to the Planned Unit Development - Residential (PDR) District. The site is lying along the south side of Boylston Road, approximately 1,300 feet west of Adkins Road (8809, 8813 & 8819-R1 Boylston Road).
