Randy McCaslin gave the staff report for this item stating the City purchased this property through tax foreclosure and would like to turn this property into 19 lots to provide affordable housing. He noted it would be necessary and imperative to the project that the City receive free dirt, explaining that the the City is currently working on two other projects that could provide the free dirt necessary to meet the challenges of the property.

Council Member Jeff Golden stated there was a community meeting in regards to this development and the community did not seem to have any concerns that wasn't addressed by staff. He commended staffs communication with the community regarding this property.

Kenneth Shultz, Chief of Police, distributed a handout regarding the Overall Part 1 Crime Statistics for the City of High Point. He stated violent crimes are down 20% from this time last year and property crimes are down 17%, so overall there is a 17% reduction. Violent crimes right now is 9% below the 5 year average. Property crimes are down 13% for the 5 year average noting property crimes are things like thefts and burglaries. Overall the Part I crimes are down 12% compared to the 5 year average.

At this time Chief Shultz stated there is a national trend across the country regarding a Lip Sync Challenge in which the High Point Police Department accepted the Challenge. He stated he thought this would be great way to feature the community noting that Torey Lanier, Police Officer I, was very instrumental in coordinating this effort with the help of Captain Petula Sellars and Lieutenant Duane Willis. He also commended city staff Brand Cook, Communication Specialist and the Communication and Engagement Department for their hard work and tireless efforts producing and recording the challenge.

He then presented the High Point Police Department Lip Sync Challenge.

The Mayor and City Council commended the High Point Police Department as well as City Staff for their work and participation in the Lip Sync Challenge.
